

Recruitment Week

Orientation

Orientation is an in-person session the evening before formal Recruitment begins. We will go over the breakdown of the Recruitment process, what to wear, and what to expect. At this time, you will meet your Recruitment Counselor (Gamma Chi) and the other members of your Gamma Chi group. This is a very important part of the Recruitment process to prepare you for the next week!

Open Round

Immediately following Orientation, PNMs will break into their small groups with their Recruitment Counselors. From there, they will watch a brief video from each of our 11 chapters. Videos from each chapter will be used to give an overview of their organization. Once PNMs have completed viewing each video, they will make their first selections to go into Philanthropy Round the following day.

Philanthropy Round

Philanthropy Round will take place August 13-15. PNMs can be invited back to up to 8 chapters to visit. During this round, PNMs will have the opportunity to talk with chapter members regarding their philanthropic efforts. They will also watch videos that show examples of what our chapters do as it relates to both philanthropy and service, at not only a campus level but also locally and nationally as well.

Recruitment Week

Sisterhood Round

Sisterhood Round will take place August 16-18. PNMs can be invited back to up to 5 chapters to visit. They will get a chance to gain a deeper understanding of what sisterhood and the chapter facility look like. At this time chapters will also review their financial transparency information. This will give an opportunity for PNMs to see what it could look like to be a member of their organization financially. This is also a good time to ask questions before Preference Round.

Preference Round

Preference Round will take place on August 19. During this round, PNMs will have the opportunity to visit up to 2 chapters before making their final selections. This will be the only round of Recruitment that a t-shirt is not worn. Instead, PNMs will be asked to wear cocktail attire. It is an important day not only for the PNMs, but also for chapters as well.

Bid Day!

Finally, our Recruitment week will conclude with the most exciting day of the week, Bid Day on Saturday, August 20! Bid Day is the day you will receive your official invitation to join a sorority! This is a very exciting time for both you and the chapters.

What do they do?

Recruitment is an exciting and memorable experience, but it can be a hectic and emotional time as well. Recruitment Counselors, referred to as Gamma Chis, are undergraduate women representing the various sororities at the U of A, who have disaffiliated from their chapters for the week of Recruitment to help you through the process. These women have been through extensive training in preparation for this week and have participated in Recruitment themselves. They are available for you 24 hours a day as impartial listeners, guides, and friends. Get to know your Gamma Chi because they want to get to know you and help you make the best decision based on your personality and interests. You will meet your Gamma Chi for the first time at Recruitment Orientation. You will also have the opportunity to meet with her each day of Recruitment. These women are so excited to help you find your home!

Greek Life FAQs

How do I sign up for Recruitment?

In order to sign up for Recruitment, you must register online through the University of Arkansas Office of Greek Life Website at uagreeks.uark.edu.

Do I need letters of recommendation to go through Recruitment?

Letters of recommendation are not required to go through Recruitment, but it is highly encouraged that each PNM have at least one letter of recommendation per chapter. Letters of recommendation are simply letters of reference written by an alumna of a sorority at the University of Arkansas. It is appropriate and highly encouraged for you to obtain your own letters of recommendation. You can begin this process by informing friends, teachers, and relatives that you are participating in formal Recruitment at the University of Arkansas. All letters of recommendation must be postmarked by August 1. More information regarding how to obtain letters of recommendation can be found on our website.

Greek Life FAQs

What does it mean if I am a legacy?

Being a legacy to a chapter does not in any way guarantee you a bid or an invitation to any round of Recruitment. However, chapters are aware if a PNM is a legacy and may consider this when choosing who to invite to parties.

How will the chapters know my GPA?

When you register online for Recruitment, you will enter your cumulative GPA. That GPA will be verified with the university's records. Please be sure to submit your final transcript to the UofA Admissions no later than August 1, 2022.

Do I need to provide my own meals during Recruitment?

You will use your on-campus meal plan during Recruitment. However, you may want to have a little breakfast in your room because Recruitment may begin before the dining halls open. We will also provide light snacks throughout the day.

Greek Life FAQs

Can I still be involved in other things on campus if I am in a sorority?

Absolutely! Sorority women are some of the most involved on campus, and many chapters require members to be involved in at least one other Registered Student Organization. In the past five years, seven Panhellenic women have served as student government officers, and two women have served as student body president.

What does accepting a bid entail?

Accepting a bid means that you sign a bid card from a specific chapter saying that you intend to pursue membership in their organization and not with any other chapter. Once you sign a bid card you are ineligible to sign a bid to any other organization for one academic year.

What are my chances of receiving a bid?

Bids are not guaranteed at any point during Recruitment. However, last year we had a retention rate over 90%. We strongly encourage all PNMs to keep an open mind throughout the process. If you are nervous about receiving a bid, it is best to talk with your Gamma Chi. She can help you better understand the process.

Financial Information

Annual Average Financial Costs

Please note: This is an average of all eleven Panhellenic chapters on the UA campus. These fees could be slightly higher for some chapters. During Sisterhood Round, each house will present a breakdown of their dues to give you an idea as to what your financial commitment will be. We will release full financial breakdown documents for each chapter by August 1st. In addition, these fees do not include t-shirts or any other attire an individual member may choose to purchase throughout the year. It is strongly encouraged that you budget for t-shirts! Most t-shirts range from \$15-\$20. You will want to represent! However, please don't break the bank in doing so!

Fees are subject to change annually as determined by its national organization, house corporation, and/or local chapter.

Positive Panhellenic Contact

The National Panhellenic Conference's Positive Panhellenic Contact and Promotion of the Sorority Experience policies are not about promoting one's organization and/or chapter. Chapters and their members' primary focus should be promoting UA Panhellenic and encouraging women to sign up for Recruitment.

More specifically, the University of Arkansas Panhellenic Sorority Experience is defined as events and activities where all chapters and their membership participate in each experience. This includes but is not limited to philanthropy and community service, sisterhood, academics, community building, positive social experiences, leadership development, educational programming, on and off campus involvement, career development, mentorship, registered student organizations, health and wellness, cross council relations, and diversity and inclusion efforts.

When discussing the Panhellenic Sorority Experience, chapters should refrain from mentioning specifics of their sorority or organization but rather share a positive holistic overview of Arkansas Panhellenic. Potential New Members may ask questions about chapters. However, chapters should not coerce PNMs or encourage them to ask specific chapter-related questions. Again, the primary focus should be promoting UA Panhellenic, Go Greek, and registering for recruitment.

Letters of Recommendation

Letters of Recommendation are simply letters of reference written by an alumna of a sorority to her sorority's chapter at the University of Arkansas. It is appropriate and highly encouraged for you to obtain your own letters of recommendation. You can begin this process by informing friends, teachers, and relatives that you are participating in formal Recruitment at the University of Arkansas. The alumna can either write a personal letter of reference or obtain a standard form from National Chapter Headquarters. Many local Alumnae Panhellenic Associations will also provide forms to women. The University of Arkansas Panhellenic Council does not provide these forms.

Letters of Recommendation must be sent directly to individual chapters as directed below.

Any letters must be postmarked by August 1, 2022.

Let's Speak Greek!

ACTIVE: a fully initiated member of fraternity or sorority

ALUMNA(E): an initiated member of a sorority that has left the collegiate Greek system

BID: a formal invitation to become a New Member of a sorority

CHAPTER: refers to an individual fraternity or sorority house; chapter names are different on all college campuses

FUNCTION: a social gathering of Greek organizations

GREEK: a member of a fraternity or sorority

HAZING: any activity that is required of an Associate or New Member that is not required of an Active Member

IFC (Interfraternity Council): the coordinating body of fraternities on a college campus

INITIATION: the traditional ritual that brings a New Member into full membership

LEGACY: a potential member of a sorority who is a daughter, granddaughter, or sister of a member of a Greek organization

NATIONAL: a term referring to the central organization of a given sorority or fraternity

Let's Speak Greek!

NPC (National Panhellenic Conference): a conference comprised of 26 national sororities

NPHC (National Pan-Hellenic Council): an organization comprised of 9 men's and women's fraternities, all of which are historically African American

NEW MEMBER: a member of a fraternity or sorority who has not yet been initiated

POTENTIAL NEW MEMBER (PNM): a person participating in Recruitment or interested in becoming part of the Greek system

QUOTA: the maximum number of New Members that a sorority or fraternity can take during Formal Recruitment

RECOMMENDATION: a written recommendation for a PNM from an alumna of a chapter

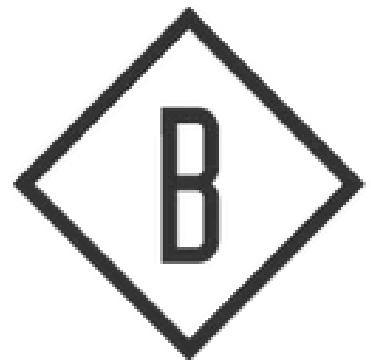
